

Heron Lakes 18-Hole Women's League
Minutes of December 1, 2022

President Diane Gaudet called the meeting to order at 12:03 p.m. with 18 members present.

REPORTS:

Secretary-Linda Anhorn had nothing to add to the report emailed to the members. Nita Calow moved and Shelley Burnett seconded to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer-Debra stated that the bank balance is \$4,339.20.

Debra DeVault moved and Rita Folk seconded the motion to approve a document to be used when notifying Wells Fargo of changes as to who is authorized to access our bank account. This document will also list who no longer is authorized. Motion carried.

New Members-Penny Dixon reported that we now have 45 members.

Rules-Judy Dunitz

Out-of-bound on # 13 - ...the par 4 headed to Rec 1. There are white stakes on the right side of the cart path that mark where to OB is located. However, in the area next to the pond, there is grass and it can be played from. If you go in the pond, we take a 1-stroke penalty and drop your ball close to where it entered the pond, but no closer to the hole.

Drop Zones on #16

The Zone to the right of the green will be used as a free drop if you land in the pebbled planting area to the right/back of the green or cart path.

The Zone at the back of the green is to be used, with a 1-stroke penalty, if you go into the water behind the green or on the 17th tee box.

The water in the front and to the left of the green is a penalty area. You must drop using normal penalty area rules. Nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole for a 1-stroke penalty. To clarify, if you go into the water in front of the green, you must drop on the line that the ball crossed into the water, keeping the water in play. You cannot bring the ball into the fairway to the side and take the water out of play AND you cannot use the drop zone to the right of the green.

Water Penalty Area Clarification

All water hazards (penalty areas) are lateral, the water's edge defines the hazard line, unless marked by hazard stakes (not the concrete edge). The concrete borders are man-made. You are entitled to free relief if these borders interfere with your swing or stance.
